







We believe Invercargill Airport has the capacity, infrastructure, location and determination to be the Airport of choice for private jet operations in the South.

Invercargill Airport has New Zealand's third longest runway and has one of the highest airport availabilies in New Zealand. The airport is a modern facility (upgraded in June 2016) which is well supported by the excellent aviation infrastructure, training facilities, and offers space to park private jets of all sizes.





Aviation Environment

Southland has one of the largest low traffic airspace in New Zealand, with Air Traffic Control provided at Invercargill Airport.

Southland is blessed with stunning scenery. In flying terms, this translates to a variety of terrain, ranging from gently rolling pasture and hill country to rugged coastlines, alpine lakes, snow-capped mountains and complex alpine terrain. The landscape is accompanied by a wide range of weather conditions, from beautiful clear sunny days in summer and winter, to cold, blustery conditions. In almost all conditions Invercargill Airport remains open to service its customers.

Southland's daylight hours are another blessing for aviators. In summer, daylight begins as early as 5am while the evening twilight extends as late as 10.30pm, which translates to an incredible 16 hours flying time. This provides long, lower risk opportunities to use the Airport aviation facilities.

On a dark, clear night, it is possible to witness the world-famous Aurora Australis (Southern Lights). This magical atmospheric condition is like a spectacular light show in the night sky. It occurs when particles from the sun interact with the earth's magnetic field - the resulting electric charge makes the gases in the atmosphere glow red, yellow and green.

Stewart Island's Maori name is Rakiura, which means 'Heavenly Glow', a reference to the fabulous sunsets you'll see in Southland.

Invercargill Airport

Invercargill Airport, the main air transport hub for Southland, is located 3 kilometres by road from Invercargill Central Business District and 28 kilometres from the Port of Bluff.

Invercargill Airport is fully compliant with the International Civil Aviation Organisation obligations as required by the New Zealand Civil Aviation Act 1990.

The extension of the runway that occurred during 2004-05 allows airlines to operate Boeing 737-800 and A320 Aircraft out of Invercargill Airport. Invercargill Airport serves the Southern Basin and is the closest New Zealand airport to the Australian cities of Melbourne and Sydney.

Invercargill Airport has a new modern terminal and is only a 2-hour drive or 50 minutes by Helicopter to Queenstown. Normal Operation times are between 5.30am and 9.00pm, but we have the flexibility to operate outside of these hours by request. Fuel is available at Invercargill Airport.

Invercargill Airport Runway

- · The Airport has one sealed runway and two grass runways.
- The sealed runway has a length of 2,210 metres and a width of 45 metres.
- The runway strength has been assessed as capable of accepting up to Boeing 767 type aircraft.
- The airport is operational for 24 hours per day and the approach and take-off fans are not obstructed by terrain.
- The width is comparable to all major international airports in New Zealand
 The runway strip is 150m wide, with the fill slopes being at 2.5% drop from the runway edge.
- Each of the runway extensions have Runway End Safety Areas included in them, which were of the minimum length of 90m, as stated by the AC139-06A.
- Thicker asphalt surfacing of 100mm for 60m at each end to allow for high stresses induced by tightly turning aircraft.
- Asphaltic concrete surface is of the Asphaltic Concrete Mix 14 type. This mix has additional resistance to surface rutting when under high wheel loadings and higher friction levels than that of more conventional mixes used in New Zealand.
- It is fully capable for all narrow-bodied commercial jet aircraft.
- The runway has a transverse slope of between 1-1.5% in line with the ACN AC139-06A standard.
- It has full lighting and navigational aids (except ILS).

During the runway extension, the terminal apron was also extended along the western edge. This was to increase the capacity of the apron for aircraft parking.


The Airport has routine passenger transport (RPT) flights arriving and departing regularly during the day. The Apron is capable of supporting all RTP customers and has the capacity to provide short to medium term parking on some stands and longer term parking in the GA areas.

The Airport does not have any available Hangar space, but development opportunities would be considered.



Invercargill Airport Apron Parking

Invercargill Airport have stands 1-5 and can offer stands 1, 4 and 5 to private aircraft. Parking is also available in the GA areas of the Apron for smaller aircraft.

- 92 m2 training room and 57.5 m2 meeting room and additional private meeting space facilities are available.

Helicopter Operations

Helicopter operations run by Heliventures NZ at the airport include private chartered flights, scenic flights and commercial or industrial operations such as spraying, surveying, marine transport, search and rescue, line repair, photography, filming, construction and conservation assignments.

Heliventures can provide transport between Invercargill and Queenstown – Flight time: 50 minutes \$715.00* per person.

Southland Lifestyle

Invercargill is the gateway to the Southern Tourism Region and is in close proximity to destinations that include Queenstown, Fiordland, Milford Sound and Stewart Island. The Southland community is very safe, with a low crime rate and a friendly, welcoming culture.

Southland contains the world-famous UNESCO World Heritage site of Milford Sound, Fiordland National Park, Stewart Island/Rakiura National Park, and the rugged Catlins. - The world-famous Bluff Oyster Festival is a chance to taste some of the freshest oysters plucked out of the ocean before they are exported around the world.
- Shakespeare in the Park is held in Invercargill's Queens Park. This annual festival showcases some of Shakespeare's best works in an accessible, interactive outdoor environment.
- The Southland Festival of the Arts showcases outstanding imported and local arts activities in a range of genres: theatre, music, dance, literary arts and galleries.
- The annual Tour of Southland captivates the country as road cyclists from around the world participate in this six-day stage race right across Southland.
- Buskers from around the world descend on Invercargill for the annual Southland Buskers Festival, which unleashes several days of humorous hijinks.
- The International Food Festival offers the opportunity to tantalise your taste buds with food and entertainment from around the world.
- Run, walk or bike the 12 kilometre Surf to City fun race which starts from Oreti Beach and ends up in the centre of the city at Queens Park.

There are a wealth of other activities held during the year, including international and national sports competitions, the Royal New Zealand Ballet, the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra, a number of shows and performances, and popular New Zealand bands and singers.
